Dear Governor Brown:


Transitional kindergarten, which will be implemented in more than 700 school districts throughout California next fall, is a historic opportunity to lay the foundation for proficiency in the early elementary years.

As the Superintendent of Long Beach Unified School District, I know that transitional kindergarten is a winning solution for California. Research shows that children who attend kindergarten readiness programs like transitional kindergarten are more likely to do well in school and attend college because these children are better prepared to succeed in kindergarten and beyond. Parents now have an additional option to ensure their children enter kindergarten with the maturity and skills they need to excel, and schools like ours will benefit because children will be better prepared for success in and less likely to be placed in special education and retained in later grades. Finally, California's economy will be strengthened by a well-educated, globally competitive workforce.

Large urban districts have a lot of work ahead of us, and Long Beach Unified School District is excited about this opportunity to focus on promising practices, strategies and resources so that school districts like ours can implement transitional kindergarten in a high-quality and efficient way.
